






Our Mission Statement

About Us

Residents Encounter Christ (REC) is an interdenominational, Christian ministry that brings the Good News of God's grace to residents in jails.

During a three-day REC experience, a team of about (35) Christian men and women from different denominational backgrounds, both lay and clergy, enter a correctional facility to share Christian community.

Through a series of talks and group discussions, we teach priorities and goal-setting, and encourage a strong faith as a way of life for their future.

After the initial REC is held at a jail, volunteers from the REC community visit the residents monthly for "gatherings" to continue to support them in their spiritual growth.
