Referral Information Available in the State of Florida

By dialing 211 (or searching the web at: www.211florida.org), anyone is now able to access bilingual information about health and human services.

The information provided by 211 has been vetted and entered into their database. Note: Not all 211 locations are open 24/7/365.

When 211 is dialed, a professional Referral Specialist works with the caller to assess their needs and determine the available options. Information is then provide about appropriate programs and services in the areas of:

Basic Human Needs:

Food banks, clothing, shelters, housing options, rent assistance, and utility assistance.

Employment Support:

Financial assistance, job training, transportation assistance, and education programs.

Health Resources:

Health insurance, maternal health, medical information lines, crisis intervention, support groups, counseling, drug/alcohol intervention and rehabilitation, and mental health information.

Physical and Emotional Needs:

Domestic abuse information.

Support for Older Americans and Persons with Disabilities:

Adult day care, congregate meals, Meals on Wheels, respite care, home health care, transportation, and homemaker services.

Support for Children, Youth, and Families:

Child care, after-school programs, Head Start*, family resource centers, summer camps, recreation programs, mentoring, tutoring, and protective services.

* Head Start is a national school-readiness program that provides education, health, nutrition, and parent-involvement services for low income families.

Reentry:

Assistance for ex-offenders.

Military & Family Support:

Programs and community resources for veterans and their families.

Other Information Includes:

1. *Record Gone* – offers several links to resources for Florida ex-offenders that may help with employment, development of work skills, and housing.
